**LINK TV'S *MOSAIC* FIRST U.S. NEWS PROGRAM TO SHOW
EXTENSIVE TELEVISED EXCERPTS OF MIDDLE EAST
REACTION TO SHOCKING NEW ABU GHRAIB PHOTOS**

(DIRECTV Ch. 375 & DISH Network Ch. 9410)

San Francisco, CA—February 15, 2006—Tonight Link TV's Peabody Award-Winning Show **MOSAIC**, an unedited compilation of daily news from over 30 stations in the Middle East, will be the first U.S. television station to show the spectrum of Arab reaction to the airing of new Abu Ghraib photos. These new photos, which originally appeared Tuesday on Australia's **SBS DATELINE**, show horrific abuses being committed at Abu Ghraib. According to **SBS DATELINE**, these photographs were taken at the same time as the other notorious Abu Ghraib pictures, but show greater and more widespread abuse, including "new incidents of homicide, torture and sexual humiliation." Coincidentally, the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU) is currently engaged in an ongoing legal battle with the Defense Department over the release of Abu Ghraib photos.

Tune in tonight at 7:30 pm PT/10:30 pm ET to see how citizens throughout the Middle East are reacting to these new photos. Only on Link TV will you see what the region's more than 250 million residents are saying about this breaking story.
